Call for Officers

2023-25 Call for Omega Omicron Chapter Officer Nominees

The Leadership Succession Committee wishes to extend a call for chapter officer nominations for the office/committee positions listed below. Please feel free to nominate a potential candidate or self-nominate to serve your chapter — we need you!! The term is July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2025. Positions include:

Vice President (who also serves on the Program Committee) Performs various responsibilities on behalf of the Society. This position performs the duties of the president in the president's absence. The Vice President also facilitates achievement of goals and oversees at least two Society programs each year. The Vice President often oversees the membership engagement efforts and serves on committees as needed. (two-year commitment)

Membership Committee Chair: The committee associated with the membership chair promotes membership renewal, engagement, and involvement; oversees mentoring programs; plan and implement membership orientation events and promote the honor society to the current and future membership. (two-year commitment)

Awards Committee Chair: Oversees the development, review and revision of criteria and funding for recognition awards and scholarships distributed by the chapter. Additionally, oversee the recruitment, selection and communications processes

associated with chapter and international awards. (two-year commitment)

Treasurer: The treasurer's responsibility is to manage chapter funds. This includes preparing the annual budget and developing or maintaining fiscal policies and procedures. The treasurer is required to present financial information to the Board of Directors at each meeting and works with the President to complete the financial section of the annual report. (two-year commitment)

Leadership Committee (3 positions): The Leadership Succession Committee, under the direction of the Chair, takes responsibility for overseeing the execution of Society elections. The chair (selected from the committee members) is responsible for recruiting nominees for Society leadership, preparing the election ballot and notifying candidates of election results. (two-year commitment)

Newsletter Chair: The committee associated with the newsletter chair publishes a professional newsletter twice per year with the Society news. (two-year commitment)

As a nurse leader in performance improvement, I have the privilege of working with healthcare leaders from across the United States to help them to improve their organization's patient outcomes and operational efficiencies. Recently, I had the opportunity to work alongside hospitals and health systems as they attempted to better understand their equity-related data and designed quality improvement projects based on the findings.

As a nurse leader yourself, you may have wished, from time to time, that your boss would take time to see for themselves what it is you do on a daily basis and the barriers that prevent you from doing your job. I couldn't agree more and I'm here to tell you there's hope! In fact, nurses engaged in process improvement are utilizing a process observation technique called Gemba walks. This means that quality improvement specialists are observing firsthand the work being done and asking questions of frontline staff to glean where problem areas exist. I recently wrote a blog about healthcare organizations across the country using Gemba walks as a process improvement strategy to improve equity-related data collection. 
